1. STATEMENT OF PROCEEDINGS & ARREST

On July 15, 2026, Annemarie Lena Scott was formally apprehended by state law enforcement agencies following an intensive multi-agency investigation. The defendant, a 30-year-old female measuring 5 feet 5 inches in height, was immediately taken into custody under suspicion of orchestrating a calculated double homicide and financial fraud scheme designed to liquidate her family's estate for personal enrichment.

2. THE CONSPIRACY AND STAGED HOME INVASION

Investigators unraveled an elaborate criminal enterprise engineered entirely by the defendant. Financial forensics established that Scott faced mounting monetary pressures and plotted the systematic execution of her elderly parents to claim substantial multi-million-dollar life insurance policies.

Rather than executing the act personally, Scott contracted professional mercenaries—external operatives operating as hired assassins—instructing them to infiltrate her parents' suburban residence. The directive explicitly required the perpetrators to simulate a violent, chaotic armed home invasion to divert law enforcement suspicion and establish a fabricated narrative of random predatory crime.

Evidentiary Finding: Digital wiretaps, encrypted financial transfers, and recovered communication logs definitively linked Scott to the contract killers. This deliberate staging of an armed robbery-turned-assassination heavily influenced both the prosecution's strategy and the ultimate severity of the judicial sentencing.

3. RAPID TRIAL AND UNANIMOUS GUILTY VERDICT

Due to the airtight digital footprint, financial paper trails, and unassailable ballistic matches recovered from the crime scene, the judicial process advanced through an expedited rapid trial docket. The defense presented no substantive refutation against the overwhelming weight of physical and electronic evidence.

4. ADJUDICATION AND CAPITAL SENTENCING

Following a compressed judicial timeline, the presiding magistrate submitted the case to the jury. Deliberations concluded swiftly with a unanimous verdict returning a finding of **GUILTY** on all counts of capital murder, conspiracy, and insurance fraud.

In delivering the sentence, the bench noted the chilling premeditation, the cold exploitation of third-party mercenaries, and the desecration of familial trust for monetary gain. Given the statutory parameters governing heinous capital offenses involving contractual murder, the court handed down the sentence of execution.

5. JURISDICTIONAL LIMITATIONS AND ASTEN TRANSFER

A significant legal impediment arose concerning the method of execution. While the severity of Scott's crimes warranted capital punishment under Louisiana statute, the jurisdiction of Louisiana does not authorize capital punishment via firing squad.

To uphold the mandated sentence without violating state-level correctional frameworks, federal and interstate judicial compacts authorized a special administrative transfer. Custody of the convict was formally reassigned to the specialized **ASTEN** facility security directorate.

6. HISTORICAL PRECEDENT AT ASTEN FACILITY

Under the authority of the ASTEN security framework, Annemarie Lena Scott is designated as the first convict in the history of the facility to undergo execution via firing squad. Preparations for the carrying out of the sentence have been ordered to proceed in accordance with high-security administrative protocols.
